

Immigrants Are Major Contributors to Georgia's Agriculture Industry

*An estimated **16,000** immigrants work in Georgia's agriculture industry, making up **28%** of Georgia's agriculture workforce.*

Immigrants of all backgrounds boost Georgia's agriculture industry. Some 2,000 immigrants, or about 13% of all immigrants in Georgia's agriculture industry, are U.S. citizens. About 1,000 are lawful permanent residents, and 1,000 are temporary immigrants on a nonimmigrant visa.

Annual combined income from immigrant agriculture industry workers

Dreamers—undocumented immigrants who came to the U.S. as children before 2021 and are either in school or have graduated from high school—number 2,000 workers in Georgia's agriculture industry.

\$92 million

Annual combined taxes paid by immigrant agriculture industry workers

Immigrant groups protected from deportation—DACA recipients, TPS holders, people seeking asylum, and those waiting for a permanent residency visa—**have access to work permits, making up an estimated 1,000 agriculture industry workers in Georgia.**
