

Immigrants Make KY-2 Stronger

*An estimated **51,000** immigrants live in KY-2, making up **7%** of the total population.*

*Immigrants live in **8%** of households in KY-2.*

Immigrants contribute to every sector of KY-2's economy. Some 8% of KY-2's labor force are immigrants, including 12% of the construction industry, 17% of agriculture, 18% of manufacturing, 3% of business services, and 7% of leisure and hospitality.

About 1,000 immigrants in KY-2 work in STEM-related jobs, of which 26% are temporary immigrants on H-1B and other temporary work visas. In all, 14% of STEM degree holders in KY-2 are immigrants.

Immigrants of all backgrounds boost KY-2's communities. Some 12,000 immigrants, or about 23% of all immigrants in KY-2, are U.S. citizens. About 11,000 are lawful permanent residents, and 1,000 are temporary immigrants (including nonimmigrant visa holders and international students).

An estimated 5% of individuals in KY-2, or some 41,000, are either undocumented immigrants or live with an undocumented immigrant. Some 6,000 U.S. citizen children in KY-2 live with an undocumented parent, while some 1,000 U.S. citizen spouses are married to an undocumented immigrant. Some 4,000 undocumented individuals in KY-2 have lived in the U.S. for more than 10 years, with 1,000 of those living in the U.S. for more than 20 years.

Dreamers—undocumented immigrants who came to the U.S. as children before 2021 and are either in school or have graduated from high school—number 1,000 and **contribute \$34 million annually to KY-2's economy.** They also contribute \$5 million in state and local taxes each year.

An estimated 5,000 immigrants in KY-2 are waiting for a decision on their asylum claim, and contribute \$129 million to KY-2's economy annually.

Immigrant groups currently protected from deportation—DACA recipients, TPS holders, people seeking asylum, and those waiting for a permanent residency visa—**have access to work authorizations, making up an estimated 3,000 workers in KY-2's labor force, and paying an estimated \$20 million annually in state and local taxes.**
